English Language Entry Requirements for Foundation Studies & Diploma Programs

NOTE: You do not have to provide proof of proficiency in English if you were born in: American Samoa, Australia, Canada, Fiji, Ghana, Ireland, Kenya, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Tanzania, United Kingdom (Including Northern Ireland), United States of America or Zambia **AND** have at least one qualification from one of the countries listed **AND** the language in which you undertook the qualification was English **OR** if you were not born in one of the above countries **BUT** you have completed senior secondary study or at least one year of full-time university study in one of these countries **AND** the language in which you undertook this qualification was English.

BEING BORN IN AUSTRALIA OR ONE OF THE COUNTRIES LISTED DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY FULFILL YOUR ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS. YOU MUST ALSO HAVE AT LEAST ONE ASSESSABLE QUALIFICATION FROM ONE OF THE COUNTRIES LISTED.

RECOGNISED ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROVIDERS

EVIDENCE OF ENGLISH PROFICIENCY IS VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 2 YEARS FROM THE DATE OF THE TEST OR THE DATE OF COMPLETION OF STUDIES. PLEASE NOTE THAT IF TWO PIECES OF ENGLISH EVIDENCE ARE SUBMITTED, THE MOST RECENT WILL BE GIVEN PRIORITY.
